**CHARACTERISTICS OF THE CLASS:** Works under the supervision of an Airport Firefighter Supervisor. Responsible for timely response to all emergency situations within established emergency response and recovery guidelines; enforcing airfield security, operations and maintenance standards and regulations; and building, grounds, and equipment maintenance/repair. May assume supervisory duties in the absence of the Airport Firefighter Supervisor.

**EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:** Performs work in aircraft rescue and fire fighting; emergency medical technician (EMT) duties; airport operations; airport, building, grounds, and equipment maintenance and repair; snow removal; and airport security. Responds to aircraft accidents and extinguishes fires of highly volatile aircraft fuels, rescue and administers medical treatment to persons involved, and fire and medical incidents in and around airport buildings and facilities. Wears protective clothing and uses specialized equipment for fighting and extinguishing fires, rescuing individuals trapped in burning or crashed aircraft and administering medical treatment. Inspects airfield and navigational aids for compliance with established standards and regulations. Conducts regular inspections of all structures at the airport for compliance with established fire safety and security policies. Assists in building, grounds, and equipment maintenance and repair. Performs general housekeeping duties. Assists as needed, in new building and construction work. Performs related work as required.

**WORK CONDITIONS:** Exposure to hazardous materials and conditions; required to be able to use and/or wear a variety of safety equipment; required to work in adverse weather conditions.

### **KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:**

**Knowledge of:** fire fighting techniques and equipment; modern fire rescue methods and equipment, and emergency medical techniques; aircraft rescue and firefight techniques; airport operations and FAR Part 139 standards; maintenance procedures on the various types of fire fighting and fire rescue equipment; methods and practices applied in generalized preventative maintenance, repair, remodeling and construction activities; maintenance, and grounds machinery and equipment.

**Skill/Ability to:** fight various types of fires; administer emergency medical care; act quickly, calmly and decisively in emergency situations; operate assigned fire fighting equipment; perform generalized preventative maintenance, repair, remodeling and construction activities; operate motorized vehicular equipment.

**SPECIAL SELECTION FACTORS:** Possession of a current Arizona Driver's license appropriate to the assignment at time of appointment. Possession of a current Arizona Commercial Driver's License (CDL) appropriate to the assignment at time of appointment. Must possess a current Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) certification at time of appointment. Must qualify as an Aircraft Rescue and Firefighter under FAR 139. Must qualify in airfield operations. One year of experience equivalent to an Airport Firefighter 1; OR one year as a professional airport fire fighter. A medical/physical evaluation is required prior to appointment.

Any combination of training and experience that meet the knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSAs) may be substituted.
