CHARACTERISTICS OF THE CLASS: Under direction, is responsible for professional pharmaceutical inspection in all facets of the drug and device industry and the dispensing of drugs and devices to ensure compliance with state and federal statutes and regulations; for evaluating pharmacy intern training; for investigating complaints and for assisting in the direction of the state pharmaceutical inspection and control functions; and performs related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES: Inspects the manufacturing, repackaging, transportation, storage, sale and distribution of all drugs, dental supplies, surgical supplies, veterinary supplies and devices to ensure product purity, potency, stability, proper labeling, the appropriateness of the equipment used and proper licensures; involved are the inspections of manufacturers, wholesalers, community and hospital pharmacies, stores that sell over-the-counter drugs or devices, stores that sell drugs or devices for veterinary use, surgical and dental supply distributors, hospitals, nursing homes, and the offices of doctors, dentists, podiatrists, and veterinarians; investigates complaints and makes recommendations on corrective measures; makes audits of firms to account for drugs; works closely with medical, nursing and hospital administrators, law enforcement officers, health program officials, college of pharmacy and others in the performance of work; writes reports; supervises and evaluates intern training and instructs Drug Inspector I's.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

Knowledge of: pharmaceutical sciences such as pharmacology, pharmaceutical math, and toxicology. special instruments and techniques used in compounding and manufacturing pharmaceuticals, state and federal drug laws pertaining to drugs and devices. different fields pertaining to drugs and devices such as hospitals and community pharmacies, wholesaling, manufacturing, illicit traffic, and management including record keeping.

Skill/Ability: to inspect a variety of installations to ensure compliance with laws. established effective working relations in a regulatory atmosphere. explain state and federal laws pertaining to drugs and devices and to induce voluntary compliance where possible. speak and write effectively.

Prefer: Any combination of training and experience that meet the knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSAs) may be substituted. Typical ways to obtain the KSAs would be:

- Degree from an accredited school of pharmacy.
- Completion of a pharmacy internship and one year of experience equivalent to that of a Drug Inspector I.

SPECIAL SELECTION FACTORS: Current license as a Registered Pharmacist issued by the State of Arizona.
