CHARACTERISTICS OF THE CLASS: Under direction, is responsible for the most difficult or involved environmental sanitation inspections of commercial, manufacturing, processing, transportation and storage facilities for products for human use and consumption, of commercial and institutional human habitation and their environs and of the disposal of solid and hazardous wastes; induces compliance, enforces statutes in sensitive situations; collects and evaluates evidence for legal action; evaluates complex problems delegated to the local health departments, particularly in the densely populated counties, makes recommendations and implements approved remedial action; consults with and provides technical assistance to local health departments, other state agencies and industrial representatives on novel or different problems; develops and presents training programs both in and outside the agency; functions as a lead worker on special projects and in restricted program areas.

The Public Health Sanitarian II is distinguished from the Public Health Sanitarian I by considerable independence of functioning in performing the most difficult, involved and varied environmental health inspections, enforcement and legal documentation; in evaluating the more complex county programs, recommending and implementing approved remedial action; in furnishing consultation, solutions and technical assistance on difficult and novel problems; in the development and delivery of training programs; and by functioning in a lead capacity as required. It is distinguished from the Public Health Sanitarian Supervisor by spending more than 50 percent of the time in nonsupervisory duties and by responsibilities in fewer or less complicated program areas.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES: Performs evaluation of highly technical or involved sanitation programs in counties; provides technical supervision and consultation on the more complex aspects of environmental sanitation to county and municipal officials as well as industry representatives; handles novel, complex or sensitive problems, assignments and investigations especially where court action is anticipated; surveys and reviews solid waste disposal sites and systems and prepares technical reports on findings; reviews plans for the disposal of solid waste for new subdivisions; inspects large and complex food and beverage manufacturing, processing, transportation and storage equipment and facilities for sanitary conditions and compliance with applicable statutes, rules and regulations; inspects site, construction and operation of water supply and wastewater treatment facilities and investigates complaints about them; monitors sources of portable water and conducts special studies of contaminated or polluted water; may participate in epidemiological investigations and product alerts; reviews field work of local health departments and of milk, food and beverage industry representatives; computes sanitation ratings for the interstate milk shipper list; works on technical aspects of insect or rodent control programs; works in a nonengineering highly technical capacity in water supply, water pollution or air pollution

control; assists in planning, adopting, revising and developing new and existing programs, regulations and proposed changes in legislation; prepares records and reports; may supervise and train less experienced sanitarians.

KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND SKILLS:

Knowledge of: the principles and practices of public health sanitation, including food handling and food processing, milk sanitation, water supply, solid or liquid waste disposal, insect or rodent control, air pollution control; state laws and Department of Health Services rules and regulations pertaining to environmental health.

Skill/Ability to: analyze situations accurately and adopt an effective course of action; work effectively with others; speak and write effectively; prepare concise technical reports; effect improvement in sanitary practices in the private sector and sanitary programs in the public sector.

SPECIAL SELECTION FACTORS: One year of experience as a registered Sanitarian in Arizona in an area appropriate to the assignment.
