CHARACTERISTICS OF THE CLASS: Under general direction, is responsible for administering and supervising a livestock and poultry disease eradication control program or a State meat inspection program; and performs related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES: Supervises the State Livestock and Poultry Disease Control and Eradication Program; assists in the selection of veterinary, investigative and lab personnel; supervises the inspections of animals at livestock and poultry concentration points, monitors disease testing and certification procedures; directs the diagnosis, isolation, quarantine, control, removal and eradication of endemic and exotic diseases of commercial livestock and poultry; initiates and directs epidemiological procedures; coordinates cooperative Federal and State disease control program; provides assistance and liaison to private veterinarians and the livestock industry; engages private fee veterinarians and evaluates results; directs State animal and poultry disease laboratory; formulates procedures and recommendations; prepares and review reports; supervises the State meat inspection program; assists in the selection and training of veterinary meat inspectors and lay meat inspectors; supervises antemortem and postmortem inspections and enforces sanitation requirements; recommends regulations for slaughtering and processing establishments; assigns veterinary and lay meat inspectors to establishments.

KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND SKILLS:

Knowledge of: veterinary medicine; governmental inspection programs for animals.

Skill/Ability to: administer and supervise a State livestock and poultry disease control program or meat inspection program; plan and evaluate the work of field personnel in a statewide program; understand, interpret, and explain pertinent ordinances and regulations; establish and maintain cooperative working relationships with the public.

SPECIAL SELECTION FACTORS:

Five years of experience in veterinary medicine, including two years in animal and poultry disease control or meat inspection work as appropriate to the position.

Licenses, Certificates and Registrations:

Possession of a license from the Arizona State Veterinary Medical Examining Board.
